Living Skies Come Alive at Moosomin Regional Park

Every August long weekend, the skies come alive over Moosomin Lake. For the last several years the Living Skies Come Alive Fireworks Competition has pitted two fireworks companies against one another.

Each puts on their best show—one on Saturday night, one on Sunday night—and a panel of judges selects the winner.

The fireworks shows are unlike anything else on the Prairies. Timed to music, carefully choreographed, the fireworks shows are a different calibre than anything else on the Prairies. The fireworks are shot off across the lake from the main beach, so they are reflected in the water of Moosomin Lake.

The fireworks weekend has grown over the years, with thousands of people taking in the shows each night.

The two-day fireworks competition long pitted Saskatchewan against Manitoba, but for the last two years it has gone international, as Canada took on China and the United States over the last two years.

It will be Canada versus the Philippines at the 2019 Living Skies Come Alive International Fireworks Competition at Moosomin Regional Park August 3 and 4.

"We're really excited about having the Philippines come this year," says Laurie Renneberg of the organizing committee.

ittee. "We have a very large Filipino community in town. We're hoping to get them involved as much as possible as part of our fireworks committee."

Layne McFarlane, another member of the committee, said he hopes members of the Filipino community across the Prairies come out to see the Canada vs. Philippines competition. "The Filipino community is really quite large between Winnipeg and Regina. We hope a lot of them come out." he says.

Canada will be represented in the competition by Canfire of Winnipeg, which has represented Canada at the Living Skies Come Alive International Fireworks Competition and other competitions.

The Philippines will be represented by Platinum Fireworks. Platinum Fireworks provides fireworks shows for the Enchanted Kingdom theme park in Santa Rosa, Philippines, and has competed in several international fireworks competitions.

The weekend also includes music both nights before and after the fireworks. This year, the live bands are Stuck on Red and The Firm. There are also a ton of other events on at Moosomin Regional Park that weekend, including lumberjack axe throwing in Saturday, Filipino entertainment on Sunday, bouncy toys and bumper cars for the kids, kids games, food vendors, and beer gardens.

Southeast Saskatchewan and Southwest Manitoba are home to some great rodeo events each summer

The Moosomin Rodeo Committee does a great job of

putting on an entertaining weekend each year.

July 5 and 6 will be the 26th annual Moosomin Rodeo Weekend. Friday will feature rodeo action at 6:30 p.m., and there will be entertainment in the beer gardens following the rodeo. Saturday morning will be the Chamber of Commerce Rodeo Parade at 10 am followed by a kids rodeo from noon to 3 pm and Moosomin Rodeo Idol at 3:30 pm. The rodeo action will be at 6:30 pm followed by music in the beer gardens.

The 87th annual Moose Mountain Pro Rodeo in Kennedy, Sask. will take place from July 20-21. This is one of the only pro rodeos on the prairies, with many competitors

coming from the Calgary Stampede.

The weekend will kick off with beef on a bun Saturday over lunch at the Friendship Centre and a parade on Main Street at noon. A demo derby will follow the parade. There will also be a trade show from noon to 8 pm Saturday. The

rodeo grand entry will be at 5 pm and from 2 pm to 2 am there will be entertainment in the beer gardens. On Sunday there is a pancake breakfast starting at 9 am followed by cowboy church at 11 am. The rodeo grand entry will be at 2 pm, and there be a roast beef supper and demo derby following the rodeo.

For the second year, Spy Hill will be hosting an MRCA sanctioned rodeo August 10-11. The weekend will also feature chariot and chuckwagon races.

Other western events over the summer include the Wawota Valley Ranch Rodeo held in the Little Pipestone Valley from August 2-4, and the Elkhorn Elks Western Days from August 4-5. The second annual Moosomin Ranch Rodeo is planned for July 20, and the third annual McAuley Hoedown ranch rodeo will take place August 10-11. The Whitewood Chacachas Rodeo (BRC, MRCA) will be August 9-10 and the Esterhazy Twin Valley Riding club Bullarama and Rodeo will be August 31 and September 1.

And if you still haven't got your rodeo fix after those two events, Wapella hosts the Dodge City Days Indoor Rodeo on the Thanksgiving weekend in the fall.



and the addition includes the seating area. Large decks also wrap around all sides of the building, making for a great way to enjoy the outdoor beauty of the Pipestone Valley setting.

Pat McDonald of the fundraising committee says he's excited to see the clubhouse in use this summer.

"We've heard all positive comments," he said. "We heard a lot of




'Oh, wow, this is not what we expected.' We haven't had a lot of people who have seen the finished product, but the people who have come in have really been impressed."





The Elkhorn Auto Museum, located just off Highway 1 in Elkhorn, Manitoba is a good place to stop for a quick drive into history.

The museum has been running each summer since 1967. Most of the automobile collection was donated by Isaac Clarkson, who passed away in 1971 at the age of 58.

There are over 90 vehicles on display, ranging from a 1908 Reo to a 1976 Jaguar. Automobiles aren't the only items to see at the museum. There are First Nations artifacts, guns, licence plates, spark plugs, tools, oxen yokes, bicycles, and household items on display.

A separate building houses farm equipment such as tractors and threshing machines. Most of the tractors have steel tires.

There is also an old farm house from the early 1900s that has been restored by the museum committee and moved onto the museum grounds, as well as an old school building at the museum where people can view old maps, desks, and posters.

One of the biggest events held at the museum each year is the Elkhorn Museum Day on July 1

The day includes a parade, a threshing demonstrations, and

many activities at the museum grounds.

This day of old-fashioned fun always features a number of displays and demonstrations of pioneer life, such as blacksmithing, set up around the museum grounds, while the historic automobiles are shown off outside.

During Museum Day people come from around Manitoba to set up on the museum grounds, which are usually full of families and children eager to get a peek at all the curiosities. Pie and other goodies are served on the grounds and the old school house is open to the public.

The Automobile Museum is wheelchair accessible and even provides wheelchairs for people to wheel around the displays.

The museum is open seven days a week from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. until the

week from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. until the end of September. Admission is \$10 for adults and \$2 for students. Preschoolers are free. Be sure to check out the Manitoba Antique Auto Museum while in the area.

Both courses are accessible from Moosomin by going south on Highway 8 to Highway 48. Turn west and travel through Wawota to Highway 9 and turn south.



The Moosomin Museum is a perfect space for any history buff to check out a few of the historic items of southeast Saskatchewan.

The museum is located just off Park Avenue in Moosomin—stop in for a trip to the past!

The museum features history from Moosomin and the surrounding area with two old churches, antique automobiles, and a shop with vintage artifacts to display.

According to Museum President Dennis Barry, "The ar-

According to Museum President Dennis Barry, "The artifacts range from old farm equipment to furniture originally built in Moosomin, and various others."

In addition to the collection of quality vintage vehicles, there is also an array of old farming machinery—including tractors and combines.

A highlight of the museum's collection is the restored

Fundge Snowplane.

Snowplanes were built to glide over the snow, powered by a rear propeller. Two of the major snow plane manufacturers in North America were at Moosomin and Spy Hil. The Fudge snow plane, started by Robert Fudge, was made in Moosomin in a factory at the corner of Main and Broadway. Lorch snow planes, named after Karl Lorch, were made in Spy Hill.

The snowplanes were a popular mode of winter transportation when it was more difficult to clear roads in winter.



Inside the museum, you can check out many historical relics including photos, Second World War gear, classic books, hospital equipment, military items, and uniforms.

All items have been donated by members of the com-





Walk through history at Rocanville Museum

For those interested in prairie history, you won't be disappointed with a stop at the Rocanville and District Museum. This large agricultural museum boasts an extensive collection of gas and steam engines, a restored CPR station, a school building, general store, an old church, and antique farm machinery and tools.

The museum also sells the famous Symons Oilers as souvenirs. Based out of his machine shop in Rocanville, Ernie Symons sold his oilcan, the Symons Oiler, throughout North America and around the world. Starting with his first 24 oilcans in 1924, production reached its peak during the Second World War. In 1943, Symons delivered 65,000 of his oilers to the Department of Defense for use on military vehicles, including ships, planes, and submarines. With 32 workers on the job that summer, he usually had orders for 50,000 to 60,000 units to be filled.

Symons then spent \$500 securing patents in Canada, the United States, Great Britain, and France. Containers of different sizes with different features were added in later years. With its "wire fence" handle and trademark design, Symons developed an oilcan that is still considered the standard by many today.

On display at the museum are steam engines, thresh-

ing machines, stoves, washing machines, grain mills, chinaware, small personal items, household items, tools, switchboards, First Nations artifacts, military items, school desks, and many other items of former years.

There are all sorts of interesting displays at the Rocanville Museum, including a display from when the Kraft Celebration Tour came to Rocanville, and a display dedicated to the time that Rocanville Museum participated in the world record breaking Harvest for Hunger in Langenburg.

The old school at the museum has also been modified and turned into an active and historical kids' area with lots of fun stuff for kids to do.

Rocanville Museum also hosts a Museum Day every year to help with finances.

This year Museum Day is being held on September 14, starting with a pancake breakfast and ending with a barbecue beef supper.

Demonstrations of pioneer life will be held throughout the day, and there will be entertainment and a threshing demonstration in the afternoon.

The Rocanville Museum is open in July and August from Monday to Saturday from 10 am to 5 pm and on Sunday from 1 pm to 7 pm.
















Welwyn Regional Park a hidden Prairie treasure

Tucked in the shallow valley containing Beaver Creek, Welwyn Regional Park is a hidden treasure for people who love a quick and easy getaway to the outdoors.

The park is located a little more than a kilometre north of the village of Welwyn along the 600 Grid Road that leads to PotashCorp Rocanville.

It includes Welwyn Lake, a reservoir open to swimming, fishing, and boating, and 40 campsites (some with electrical) on a hill just south of the lake.

The lake was built with the damming of Beaver Creek in the mid-1960s. Welwyn Lake is fed by springs and


run-off coming from the west. In the past, anglers have caught pike and perch there.

The park is well treed with poplar, oak, willow, and birch trees, while hazelnuts, saskatoon bushes, chokecherries, and cranberries have been found along the banks of the reservoir.

During one week over the summer, from July 8 to 12, swimming lessons are provided at the park with a registered instructor.

The Welwyn Regional Park is self-supporting and operated by a committed group of volunteers from the area.



Tourist information may be found at The Visitors Information Centre, located in the Historical Park on Highway 22. There you will also find The Saskatchewan Potash Interpretive Centre, Museum and Flour Mill.

Following are a few of the great things to do in the area:

ESTERHAZY WALKING TRAIL

The Esterhazy Regional Park took ownership of a trail which was a collection of old roads and bridges and paths cobbled together to form a loop around the Esterhazy Golf Course. The Park board decided to try and revive the trail and used the services of a professional trail builder to do so.

ESTERHAZY FLOUR MILL

This is the only fully equipped flour mill remaining in Saskatchewan that combines an elevator and a mill. Designated as a provincial heritage property in 2005, it also joined the family of national historic sites in 2007 with its designation as a National Historic Site of Canada.

KAPSOVAR HISTORICAL SITE

Kaposvar, one of the first Hungarian settlements in Western Canada, was established in 1886. Kaposvar Historical Society preserves, restores and maintains the Kaposvar Historic Site.




ESTERHAZY MUSEUM


















Old George's Museum and Hidden Village

Growing up on a farm just south of Dubuc in the 1950s, George Chopping, like all kids at the time, had dreams in life. "I wanted to go around the world, own a museum, and own a motorcycle," said Chopping.

And now he does own a museum— Old George's Museum and Hidden Village on the outskirts of Whitewood,

just off Highway 1.

It all started in 1984 with a visit to a friend in Whitewood. "I saw this antique house on my way back to Dubuc, and I thought, 'That would be perfect for a museum.' I've always wanted one," said Chopping. "So I pulled over, knocked on the door, and asked the owner if he would sell the house."

Chopping bought the house and in 1985 moved his belongings from Dubuc to Whitewood. "We moved 10 three-ton truck loads, seven van loads, five car loads, and a bit of miscellaneous other things . . . We also moved a 90 x 30 barn." Chopping says they moved a total of 1,340 boxes.

The house became known as Old George's. The name originates from Chopping's escapades as a bottle collector and member of the Parkland Bottle Collectors Club in 1978.

"I had been collecting bottles over the years, and I was writing a book about bottles I found on the Canadian Prairies," said Chopping. "Because

I had been working on it for a while, and had yet to finish it, a member started giving me the gears at a meeting. "He was laughing and said, 'Hey, Old George! Are you ever going to get that book published?"

Chopping put a lot of work into making Old George's what it is today. "When I first owned the house, I did 99 hours of sandblasting, and put up 990 square feet of brick wall," he said. "I also painted the walls, and built a deck." The house, which has 17 rooms and four fireplaces, is also his home. The rooms, from the basement to the attic, are comprised of intricate displays of nearly every antique you can imagine.

"Eighty per cent of the items are from Saskatchewan, 15 per cent are from Manitoba, and five per cent are from Alberta. A few other things are from B.C., the Harbour in Toronto, and other travels I have been on," said

Chopping.

His oldest item is a 1636 land title deed from England.

Chopping says he doesn't have a favorite item because there are too many to choose from. But, he does say that he is keen on anything related to pioneers and hard times.

As for all of the items, "I have a passion for learning about their history, and sharing that knowledge with people who come here," he said. "I also like to show off what I have. We're all big kids, but not everyone wants to admit that."

Nestled behind the house, there is also a 'hidden village' comprised of 30 buildings, including a chapel, saloon, blacksmith shop, Chinese laundromat, a clothing store and much more. There is also a stage people can perform on.

"I've been building it for the past 17 years," said Chopping. "There's a new addition nearly every day."

Chopping says he has had guests from across North America, as well as overseas.

"I always ask people to describe this place in 15 words or less. But you can't," said Chopping.

"I don't even know how to describe it. It's an unusual place that people have no idea about until they walk

through here."

Old George's has been written about in publications, including Canadian Geographic, National Geographic, and Prairies North.

"It feels great to have this place recognized . . . I always say, 'I've gotten married to it," said Chopping. "I spend all of my time doing this morning and night.

Chopping says there aren't really

hours at Old George's.

"If it's 10 p.m. and you're coming from far away, and I'm up, I'll take you on a tour," he said.





History comes alive at Cannington Manor



Cannington Manor Provincial Historic Park keeps some of the early history of the prairies alive.

Cannington Manor was one of the first attempts by settlers in what is now southeast Sas-

katchewan to establish a commercial agricultural community.

The history of Cannington Manor dates back to 1882, when one of the first groups of settlers from England and Ontario began homesteading southeast of the Moose Mountains, founding the village. It has been noted that the settlers were looking to build their dreams and create a prosperous farming community that eluded so many of them in their homelands. However, the community was very isolated and the Canadian Pacific Railway was not constructed until 1885, and even then the village was almost 60 kilometers away.

In the late 1880s the CPR constructed a branch line in the area, but it was further south than expected, and still left the village 16 kilometers from the line.

Together, the distance from the CPR, as well as the lack of farming experience of the settlers began to take its toll on the community and Cannington Manor was completely abandoned by 1900.

At Cannington Manor the first stop is the visitors centre which houses displays introducing visitors to the people and history of Cannington Manor. There are five furnished buildings in the park as well as the original All Saints Anglican Church.

Interactive activities are offered at the park and include rope making, croquet, tennis, horseshoes, and cooking.


Redvers welcomes visitors!

There's no shortage of things to do in the Estevan area, which is home to some great fishing, a beautiful regional park, live theatre through the summer, great golf, stock car races, and much more! The city invites visitors to experience some of these great amenities on offer over the summer months.

"One of the most unique experiences in Estevan is largemouth bass fishing," says Rebecca Westling, Destination, Marketing and Communications Consultant. "We are the only place in Saskatchewan where a person can come and fish for largemouth bass. The reason is because the Boundary Dam Reservoir does not freeze over and it makes it a great habitat for the bass.

"There's the arts and culture scene that's really unique here as well," adds Westling. "Souris Valley Theatre is one of the few in Saskatchewan that have live theatre. They do multiple performances throughout the year. That's quite a unique experience."

Westling says those with a need for speed should check out Estevan's Motor Speedway. "The Estevan Motor Speedway is an IMCA sanctioned banked oval dirt track that hosts IMCA Modified, IMCA Stock Car and Hobby Stock races," she says.

This year the Estevan Motor Speedway will be hosting a demolition derby called the Eve of Destruction on July 26. The Eve of Destruction coincides with a huge eventthe Rafferty Rumble—being hosted for the first time since

From July 26-28, it will be a weekend full of sports, music, street fair, market and street dance. The weekend will feature a slo-pitch tournament, flag football tournament, races at Estevan Motor Speedway, soccer tournament, and ball hockey tournament. The organizers were also hoping to include a golf tournament, beach volleyball tournament and fishing derby during the planning

On July 27, downtown Estevan will be rocking as the day starts with a pancake breakfast, the Downtown Business Association will host a large street fair, and the Estevan Art Gallery and Museum will bring an artisan and art market and one of the largest music festivals to hit the Energy City to date. Finally, the Downtown Show and Shine from years past will make a return.

The whole event promised to be a huge blast of sum-

Westling says Estevan's parks and golf courses also

make the city unique.
"Woodlawn Regional Park is quite well used," she says. "There is a day park that people can go to along the Souris River. There are walking trails, and people kayak and canoe down the river, and they fish in the river as well. There is a dog park right nearby. Woodlawn Regional Park has two sites. There is the Souris River site that's used for camping and is right near the TS&M Woodlawn Golf Course. And then there is the Boundary Dam site, and that's on the Boundary Dam reservoir. The reservoir has fishing and swimming and beach volleyball and different events held throughout the year. They have an outdoor stage and playparks for the kids.

"The TS&M Woodlawn Golf Course is an 18-hole course. It has a newly developed back nine. They have a really nice clubhouse and all the amenities they can offer, such as the pro shop and rentals. We have another course called Hidden Valley Golf. It's a nine-hole course. It is a very mature course and has been well used in our community for many years. They have a club house, a proshop and also offer mini golf there, so it's a great place to spend some time with your family.

"We have a disc golf course which is very unique to our area. If you haven't tried disc golf it's a must. The nine-hole course is in Torgeson Park and located right on Spruce Drive. There are discs on site that are available for free use."

Estevan also offers energy tours throughout the year where people can learn more about the power plants and coal mining industry in the area. In May and June the tours run five days a week, Monday to Friday, and in July and August they run Tuesday to Saturday. There is a morning tour at 9 am and an afternoon tour at 1 pm.

"It goes to the Shand power station, the Shand greenhouse, and right inside the mine pit," says Westling. "It's really neat seeing those huge machines in operation and you really get an up close and personal experience of what it's like to be a miner."

Estevan's Visitor Information Centre is located inside the Estevan Leisure Centre—a building that features all kinds of things to do. "The RM of Estevan Aquatic Centre is there," says Westling. "They do drop in recreation programming, and then there is Affinity Place where there is a walking track and weight room and gym rentals, and the public library. There are lots of different things in the one building that people can come and experience!"






Whether you are looking for a day trip, overnight or a weekend away, the Asessippi Parkland Region has something for everyone to enjoy.



Westwood Ranch and Garden Centre a unique prairie destination

If you take a drive southwest of Elkhorn, Manitoba or southeast of Moosomin you will come across a unique business unlike any other in the region.

At Westwood Ranch and Garden Centre you can shop for plants in the greenhouses there, or spend your time hanging out with zebras, lemurs and ostriches, or let your children play on Westwood's indoor 30-foot-long assault course, a large bounce tent with obstacles.

Westwood Ranch and Garden Centre is just what its name suggests—it's a greenhouse that also features exotic animals as well as a range of other activities for people to have fun with.

"It's a double stop shop," says owner Mark Humphries. "The parents usually go off with the kids and pick plants and then they can be entertained afterwards with the animals and everything else. It makes for a good day out."

In addition to the greenhouses at Westwood, there is a small zoo on site that features everything from exotic animals to farm animals, as well as a gold mine where kids can sluice for gold, an assault course, a full outdoor play area, a model train display, and a small gift shop and concession.

Westwood's animals include zebras—which Humpries says are the only zebras in Manitoba or Saskatchewan—lemurs, ostriches, emus, parrots, lots of different farm animals, including sheep, pigs, goats, and horses, miniature ponies and foals, exotic birds, fish, a rabbit village that kids can go into, jumping horses, donkeys, a bearded dragon, and wallaroos.

Westwood Ranch has grown in popularity over the year. Aside from daily vistors, Westwood Ranch also does school and corporate tours, as well as tours for people with disabilities, as the location is wheelchair accessible.

Humphries says they have had up to 9,400 visitors some summers.

Virden full of heritage buildings

Virden is well known for its many restored heritage buildings, dating back to the early 1880s.

Architectural styles are varied with most of the heritage being of either fieldstone or brick construction.

Many of the structures are unique in Western Canada, in architectural style and purpose.

Examples include the Aud Theater, which is unique in style as an example of a restored turn of the century opera house.

Another example is St Mary's Anglican Church, whose unique fieldstone construction exemplifies 1800s English style construction using abutments and high pitched roofs.

Virden's unique history as an early railroad center has also left the community with a central business district, rich with heritage brick buildings, constructed at the turn of the century.

Following is a bit more detail on just a few of the heritage buildings that make Virden unique:

Canadian Pacific Railway Station

Located at 425 - 6th Avenue S, the Canadian Railway Station was constructed in 1900 after the original wood frame station burnt in 1899.

It has been restored and declared a heritage building in 1994. Its unique fieldstone and overhanging eaves style was common with many rail stations in larger centers.


In the early years, many new immigrant farmers and businessmen would have first disembarked from the train at this location and passed through the doors of this station.

Today, it houses community based organizations including the Virden and Area Arts Council and the Virden Chamber of Commerce. Also included is an art gallery and a separate board room area.

The Aud Theater 228 Wellington Street

The Aud Theatre was built in 1911 as part of the municipal building. The building was open to the public on February 29, 1912. The building consisted of a government telephone exchange room, new court room, three large offices, and the opera house, costing \$32,500.

The population at this time was about 1,500. The Aud Theatre was built by W.T. Manser. The comedy "the Misogynist" was the first to play in the theatre. The Great Eastern Sign

Painting Co. of Toronto supplied the 22x30ft curtain. During the '30s and '40s the Aud was a movie theatre.

The ceiling on the stage was originally 40ft high but it was lowered to 24ft to save heat. The building was originally heated by steam which was replaced with electric heat in 1984-85 after the renovation and re-opening in 1983. When the theatre fell into disrepair it closed as a movie theatre and the town council was preparing to demolish it.

A local steering committee was formed to save it, and after substantial renovations, it was re-opened in 1983. The lower level consists of 257 seats and the upper level consists of 210 seats. The majestic curve of the balcony gives the audience a panoramic view of the stage. On either side of this are two double decker boxes or loges which add an air of sophistication.

St Mary's Anglican Church 633 9th Street

This structure is a great example of fieldstone construction.

Much of the stone for the fieldstone construction came from along the top of the Assiniboine River Valley.

The first church was a frame structure built by Clayton and Sons in 1885. This was the first church building in Virden.

Masonry work was done by Mr.

Saul of Carberry with carpentry done by Mr. Harrington of Winnipeg.

Walter Chesterton, a Winnipeg architect, designed this notable structure while building the school across the street.

The cloister and fence were added in 1952.

The church features two stained glass windows created by famous artist and sculptor Leo Mol.

The church also features a stained glass medallion window.

This window was presented by the city of Brugge, Belgium to honor the 12th Manitoba Dragoons.

Goulding House

Located at 677 - 9th Avenue, this house is today a private residence.

Built in 1893 by Dr. Goulding, the fieldstone house represents a prime example of early prairie architectural designs with bi-level verandas and upper look out.

Virden Pioneer Home Museum

Located at 390 King Street, and Established in 1970, the museum holds over 6,000 items relating to the Victorian era of Virden's history as displayed in the main house.

The original home itself was constructed in 1888 and the three additional annexes were constructed at a later date to display items from subsequent eras depicting our local heritage and culture.



Angel Acres FunZone unique in rural Sask

Most people wouldn't expect to find an 18-hole mini golf course, blaster bumper boats, human foosball and ziplines in the middle of the country in Southeast Saskatchewan, but those are just some of the things located on the farm of Tannis and Scott Lovell, who run Angel Acres FunZone, a rural amusement park located on their farm northeast of Carnduff.

Angel Acres has opened for its fourth summer, and has been growing every year. It has blaster bumper boats that squirt water, mini golf, kids and adult ziplines, a bouncy castle, a sand pit with a play structure, human foosball, beach volleyball, and a concession with a slush machine, drinks and frozen treats. There is also a picnic area where people can have birthday parties and barbecues.

"Since we expanded this year it's going crazy," Tannis Lovell said last summer. "This year we went full out, adding the boats, the beach volleyball, and the adult zipline.

"We just started out with a little bit at the beginning. We had the bouncy castles, the kids ziplines, and then bubble soccer. The bubble soccer balls didn't last very long and we wanted something bigger and better. We were out of town a little bit so we thought let's get something that will help people cool off, and that's when we thought about the bumper boats.

"There is something for everyone, for all ages, from three years old and up. One weekend we had some seniors that were on the adult zipline!"

Tannis says the addition of things like the human foosball has been a

group, they wanted to do the mini golf and human foosball, and they went into the human foosball and stayed there all night, they had a

"We added beach volleyball, the adult zipline and an in-ground pool for the bumper boats."

This summer a bouncy castle was added as well, and people can now rent barbecu

She says there has been a real increase in the number of people who are coming out to their farm to go to Angel Acres.

"In the past, during the week it would be slow and you might see the odd person trickle in throughout the day, but now we are open at 1 pm and people are there. Last night they were there until 8 o clock. It was con-

"This summer we have been way busier. And of course we get the odd person saying 'are you going to add

Tannis says people are starting to come from as far as an hour or more away.

"If the weather is hot and people are around we are busy," she says. "And we are centrally located. We are half an hour from Oxbow and Redvers, we now are getting some people from the States. We've had lots of Estevan people come out. Melita we've had, and that's about 45 minutes.'

What inspired the Lovells to start Angels Acres Fun Zone?

"Îen years ago we lost our lit-tle boy," says Tannis. "He passed away-he was two. We thought to help us with our grieving, let's get something in memory of Evan. And we also thought there isn't much stuff around Carnduff to do for young kids or families, so we just sat at our table one day and Scott, my husband, and I thought "what can we name this?" And we thought Angel Acres. We are in the country, we are on a farm, and Evan is our

"Ĭt's a fun zone. It's somewhere where you can be safe, have fun, cool off, have a good time and share with

your family and friends.
"We just thought we wanted to do something in Evan's memory. He would have been 12 this year. July 12 would have been his birthday and August 6 is the anniversary of his accident.

'So it helps us. When I hear all the laughter and see the smiles and those little ones that are turning 12, I think my son would have been that age. Just to make a little one smile or laugh is perfect."

Tannis says they are seeing a lot of repeat customers now.

"People come back to our office and say 'thank you so much, we had a great time, I'm booking my grandchild or child's birthday next year.' And they go and tell their friends or they go onto our Facebook page and talk about it, and it's like a wildfire. It's been pretty good.

"We're actually getting the odd person ask us if we have RV parking. We actually have old barns that are getting close to the end of their days that could come down and we could actually maybe turn it into an RV park, and the other day I was wondering if it would be possible to put a splash park in. So my wheels are already turning.

Angel Acres is open from June to the end of August.


Wasagaming offers a variety of restaurants ranging from Italian to a lounge-style setting. Clothing shops and specialty shops line the streets.


